One SAT-7 PARS viewer from Iran named Niloofar shares how she and her family continue to celebrate Christmas even though they face the continued threat of persecution.

"My family and I used to gather with other believers in our home to celebrate the birth of our living God who put on flesh," she says. "It is now three years that we have been unable to celebrate in a way worthy of our glorious Lord. Instead, we only have a Christmas tree and celebrate as a family because, for three years now, we have been watched carefully."

Facing persecution with faith

She continues with a sober but hopeful assessment of her situation.

"Several times they thought they could use persecution to draw us away from the glorious King, but amid the persecution, we drew closer to Jesus Christ."

Refusing to remain silent in the face of opposition, Niloofar and her son tell others about the hope they have found.

"My son tells others about Jesus, and I do too, to the extent that is possible. If I can, I get books to give to people."

> Lion of the Tribe of Judah, is greater than the storm and the trouble in which I find myself, and He is there beside me.


"We pass through the storms together. I glory in that I am His child and an heir of our Heavenly Father."

With an enthusiastic expression of encouragement, she continues. "We give


